MANAGEMENT, MINOR

Requirements for a minor may be completed at any campus location offering the specified courses for the minor. Students may not change from a campus that offers their major to a campus that does not offer their major for the purpose of completing a minor.

Program Description

Every organization depends on individuals who can effectively lead the people and processes that help the organization reach its goals. A minor in management offers students of any discipline the tools to lead and motivate people, develop effective organizational structures and processes, apply legal and appropriate human resources principles, and sustain ethical and inclusive goals.

If you see yourself running your own medical practice, landscaping operation, veterinary office, financial advising firm, or any other professional business, this minor can provide you with valuable insights into achieving your organizational goals.

What is Management?

Management is a field in business that is focused on the coordination and organization of tasks. Those tasks range from working with raw material suppliers, to running productive operations, handling employees, and more. For-profit companies, non-profit organizations, and government offices all require effective management, and an effective manager requires communication skills, strategic thinking, and appropriate leadership traits. Management expertise can be guided by models and lessons in these areas, and this minor provides exposure to these skills.

You Might Like This Program If...

You are someone who plans to be an effective leader or organizer of any activity, whether a small business, a major company, or a community organization. Having an expertise in a specialty area such as graphic design or dentistry is often not enough to run a successful business in that specialty. A management minor helps you learn to manage people, processes and your overall organization.
